
Onward March

And over these years, the Refinery has widened its range of manufacture. Naphtha, LPG, Solvent, Turpentine, ATF and Asphalt have been added to the original line of products such as petrol, kerosene, automotive/industrial diesel and fuel oil, and this in effect means more energy for transportation, industry, agriculture and for domestic use.

More significant perhaps are the achievements on the human level. On January 31, 1968, was flashed the message that our Refinery has again


completed a million man hours without lost time accident. This event follows a series of impressive safety records in past years unparalleled in the history of modern refineries in the country.

Through a "fish eye lens" hill-top view of our Refinery.






Swimming pool in the Refinery's Waltair Park Housing Colony Club. The Club has many amenities for relaxation.






Hindustan Polymers at a distance — a new industry that draws fuel from our Refinery.




A view through our pipelines carrying Naphtha from our Refinery to the Coromandel Plant.




LPG tankwagon loading.

The T.B. Hospital. The Caltex Refinery is a major donor to this hospital, started 10 years ago. The X'ray equipment was presented by our Refinery.






